From Your Pastor's Heart

Welcome to July, a month when America celebrates its Birthday! The "4th of July" is a time when vacations are taken, people have fun and fireworks are enjoyed. It brings back great childhood memories for many. This month, may we not only celebrate America's birthday, but also remember our great God Who has blessed our nation.

Samaria is a great example of how the Old Covenant in the Old Testament could not lead sinful people to a Holy God. The New Covenant that I have been preaching about on Sunday mornings in the book of Hebrews is a much better covenant. Look at what happened after Christ ascended into Heaven and became our High Priest. Acts Ch. 8:1-8 shares about the revival that took place in Samaria. The Samaritans under the Old Covenant were known as a rebellious people. This is not so with the New Covenant where Christ is the High Priest. Even the ungodly Samaritans are able to experience revival. The New Covenant allows sinful people who repent of their sins an opportunity to have a restored relationship with God. In the *Studies in the Gospel According to St. John*, J. C. Jones points out the excellency of the New Covenant.

- It excels in the NATURE of the victim. Whereas the sacrifices of Judaism were irrational lambs, the sacrifice of Christianity is the Lamb of God.
- It excels in the EFFICACY of the work. Whereas the sacrifices of Judaism only brought sin to remembrance every year, the sacrifice of Christianity took sin away. "He put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself."
- It excels in the SCOPE of its operation. Whereas the Jewish sacrifices were intended for the benefit of one nation only, the sacrifice of Christianity is intended for all nations; "it takes away the sin of the world."

So as we celebrate the "4th of July" let's not forgot it is only by God's grace that America is great. This year, pray for America because we seem to be living more like the Old Testament Samaritans than the New Testament Samaritans. May God bless you and pray that God may bless America once again with a Great Awakening!
