## From Your Pastor's Heart

Come join Providence Baptist Church during the month of December when we will observe the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This will be a time to draw near to God as I preach a series on "Attitudes toward Christmas." I am not talking about our attitude toward a season, but about our attitude toward Christ the newborn King. King Solomon, who is known as a wise man gives some insight on our attitudes in Ecclesiastes.

Ecclesiastes 5:1–7 (1) Walk prudently when you go to the house of God; and draw near to hear rather than to give the sacrifice of fools, for they do not know that they do evil. (2) Do not be rash with your mouth, and let not your heart utter anything hastily before God. For God is in heaven, and you on earth; Therefore let your words be few. (3) For a dream comes through much activity, And a fool's voice is known by his many words. (4) When you make a vow to God, do not delay to pay it; For He has no pleasure in fools. Pay what you have vowed— (5) Better not to vow than to vow and not pay. (6) Do not let your mouth cause your flesh to sin, nor say before the messenger of God that it was an error. Why should God be angry at your excuse and destroy the work of your hands? (7) For in the multitude of dreams and many words there is also vanity. But fear God.

First, let's focus on what not to do. Don't get caught up in giving the sacrifice of fools. Do not be rash with your mouth or allow your mouth to cause you to sin. Second, let's focus on what to do. Guard your steps as you enter Church and draw near to God. Let your words be few. Be faithful with your commitments to the Lord. Have a godly fear of the Lord.

I challenge each of you to do what is well pleasing to the Lord. After all, this is the best gift you will ever give Jesus.
